Driver Engineer

Pay Grade: F04

Employment Status: Full-Time

FLSA Status: Non-exempt

Experience Required: Minimum two (2) years of experience as a Firefighter and successful completion of the required written and practical test used by the City. Directly related work experience may be substituted for the formal education requirement on a year-for-year basis.

Minimum Education Requirements: High School graduation or G.E.D. and completion of minimum firefighting standards as required by the State of Florida.

Department: Fire.

Direct Supervisor: Command Officer.

Supervisory Responsibility: Direct (x); Indirect (x)

Primary Work Location: Fire House, Outdoors within City Jurisdiction

Certification: Valid State of Florida driver's license. Firefighter EMT or Paramedic and Florida Certification as Apparatus and Pump Operator.

Job Summary: Performs specialized firefighting work including driving, operating, and maintaining heavy firefighting apparatus.

Essential Job Functions

An employee in this position may be called upon to do any or all of the following essential duties:

- Drive automotive fire apparatus to fire scenes and other emergency scenes.
- Perform rescue, salvage, and, at times, general firefighting duties at fire scenes.
- Supervise station personnel in absence of Fire Captain.
- Perform all essential functions found in the Firefighter job description.
- Operate pumping equipment in accordance with proper procedures.
- Participate in fire prevention, pre-planning, inspections, and fire equipment testing activities.
- Participate in training sessions covering a wide variety of subjects.
- Clean, maintain, and make minor repairs and adjustments to fire apparatus.
- Assist in keeping fire quarters in a clean and orderly condition.
- Perform other job duties as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (KSA's) for Position

An employee in this class must have the following knowledge, skills, and abilities upon application:

Knowledge

- Modern firefighting principles, practices, and procedures including hydraulics.
- Physical layout of the City including fire hydrants and street locations.
- City's functions, policies, and procedures.

Skills

- Strong written and oral communications and relational skills.
- Public relations and customer service.



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- Operations and maintenance of various types of apparatus and equipment used in firefighting activities.
- Follow and relay complex oral and written instructions, policies and procedures.
- Operate a variety of office equipment, including computer terminal, printer, calculator, fax, typewriter, and copier.

Abilities

- Work with a high degree of independent judgment while working under pressure.
- Develop and maintain working relationships with a diverse group of associates including other professionals at the local, state, and national level and those providing services to the City.
- Operate heavy fire apparatus safely under emergency conditions.
- Make mental calculations of pressures required in various situations.
- Works outside in hazardous conditions with exposure to flames, fire, chemicals, smoke, heat, gases, moving vehicles, falling structures and debris, electricity, poor ventilation, and poor lighting.

Physical Demands

The work is heavy work which requires exerting up 100 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 20 pounds of force to move objects. The following physical abilities are required:

- Balancing: Maintaining body equilibrium to prevent falling while walking, standing or crouching on narrow, slippery, or erratically moving surfaces. The amount of balancing exceeds that needed for ordinary locomotion and maintenance of body equilibrium.
- Climbing: Ascending or descending ladders, stairs, scaffolding, ramps, poles and the like, using feet and legs and/or hands and arms. Body agility is emphasized.
- Crawling: Moving about on hands and knees or hands and feet.
- Crouching: Bending the body downward and forward by bending leg and spine.
- Feeling: Perceiving attributes of objects, such as size, shape, temperature or texture by touching with skin, particularly that of fingertips.
- Fingering: Picking, pinching, typing, or otherwise working, primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand as in handling.
- Grasping: Applying pressure to an object with the fingers and palm.
- Handling: Picking, holding, or otherwise working, primarily with the whole hand.
- Hearing 1: Perceiving the nature of sounds at normal speaking levels with or without correction. Ability to receive detailed information through oral communication, and to make the discrimination in sound.
- Hearing 2: Ability to receive detailed information through oral communication, and to make the discrimination in sound.
- Kneeling: Bending legs at knee to come to a rest on knee or knees.
- Lifting: Raising objects from a lower to a higher position or moving objects horizontally from position-to-position. Occurs to a considerable degree and requires substantial use of upper extremities and back muscles.
- Mental Acuity: Ability to make rational decisions through sound logic and deductive processes.
- Pulling: Using upper extremities to exert force in order to draw, haul or tug objects in a sustained motion.



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- Pushing: Using upper extremities to press against something with steady force in order to thrust forward, downward or outward.
- Reaching: Extending hand(s) and arm(s) in any direction.
- Repetitive Motion: Substantial movements (motions) of the wrist, hands, and/or fingers.
- Speaking: Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word including the ability to convey detailed or important spoken instructions to other workers accurately and concisely.
- Standing: Particularly for sustained periods of time.
- Stooping: Bending body downward and forward by bending spine at the waist. Occurs to a considerable degree and requires full motion of the lower extremities and back muscles.
- Talking 1: Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word including those activities in which they must convey detailed or important spoken instructions to other workers accurately, loudly, or quickly.
- Talking 2: Shouting in order to be heard above ambient noise level.
- Visual Acuity 1: Have close visual acuity to perform an activity such as: preparing and analyzing data and figures; transcribing; viewing a computer terminal; and/or extensive reading.
- Visual Acuity 2: Including color, depth perception, and field vision.
- Visual Acuity 3: Visual Acuity to determine the accuracy, neatness, and thoroughness of the work assigned or to make general observations of facilities or structures.
- Visual Acuity 4: Have visual acuity to operate motor vehicles and/or heavy equipment.
- Visual Acuity 5: Have close visual acuity to perform an activity such as: visual inspection involving small defects, small parts, operation of machines; using measurement devices; and/or assembly or fabrication parts at distances close to the eyes.
- Walking: Moving about on foot to accomplish tasks, particularly for long distances or moving from one work site to another.
